*Emergency repairs do not require ARB approval, but we do ask that you let us know so we can keep a record of this work should any questions arise.

*One reminder that the maximum fence height in the neighborhood is 5'-0" per our C&R's. The HOA has always held firm to that number.

Our technicians have continuously been conducting surveys of the ponds to ensure everything is in working order, however, if anyone notices any potential issues please let me know.

Please ensure small yard debris and leaves are placed in a brown yard waste bag. This is important so these items do not wash down the storm drain and into our ponds causing drainage issues.

Throughout the year, we've been working with The Greenery, our landscape contractor to add mulch to the islands throughout the neighborhood, install annuals at the entrance and various projects to repair lighting and irrigation systems. We've also been working to improve the process for getting the dog waste stations refilled so they are ready for use.
